Art: Paper Collages



Teacher: Eileen Lew Title of Lesson Plan: Recycling Paper Grade level: 1 Standards: RI.1,SL.1,SL.2,SL.3 Subject area: Science, Art

Learning Objectives:

The students will be able to:

- I. Tell about the importance of recycling paper
- 2. Tear paper with their hands to create a picture

Materials: Scrap paper (white), textured paper, colored paper, glitter paper, magazines, glue, brushes, small plastic containers

Vocabulary words: Texture, layering, tearing

Procedure:

- I. Gather the students on the rug. Have them sit on the perimeter
- 1. Ask...What does recycling mean? What is a collage?
- 2. Write responses onto chart tablet.
- 3. Show the students what I mean by "tearing" the paper into the different shapes.
- 4. Use a pair of scissors and cut a piece of paper in half.
- 5. Hold up the torn piece and the cut piece of paper.
- 6. Ask...What do you notice about the two pieces? How are they different? How are they the same?
- 7. Show what it means to "layer".

Modeling and Practice:

- I. Let the children know that they will use the tearing method to make the collage.
- 2. The teacher will demonstrate how to make a picture collage.
- 3. Give each student a sheet of construction paper. Send them back to their table.
- 4. Have ready in the middle of each table a tray of various types of scrap papers that the students can use to create their picture.
- 5. Students will create their own collage picture.

Share:

- I. Have the students leave their collage on the table.
- 2. Gather the students on the rug. Have them sit on the perimeter.
- 3. Tell the students that they are going to walk around the room and look and discuss each other's work.
- 4. Have students share what they notice what others did to create the collage.

Follow up:

- I. Show the students books that the pictures are made by using collage.
- 2. Make our own book(s) based on our study(ies) using collage. Example: insects, school, parks, etc...
